This year is set to be bigger and better (literally) in our new home: Kai Tak Sports Park. We're keeping the best traditions and their magic alive while raising the bar. Same, but different.

To help you survive and thrive through this iconic weekend, we've put together our top tips. Grab your costumes, mark your calendars, and get ready to dive into the fun — it's go time!

Sunday, March 30: 8:15 AM - 8:00 PM

VENUE: Kai Tak Stadium, Kai Tak Sports Park Precinct, 38 Shing Kai Road, Kai Tak, Kowloon, Hong Kong.

LINE-UP: Men's SVNS: New Zealand, Argentina, Australia, Fiji, France, Great Britain, Ireland, Kenya, Spain, South Africa, Uruguay, USA.

Women's SVNS: New Zealand, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, Fiji, France, Great Britain, Ireland, Japan, Spain, USA.

Melrose Claymores: Hong Kong China Men take on China and Japan, while Hong Kong China Women face Kazakhstan and Thailand.



▼ TICKETS

3-DAY TICKETS: General admission starts at HK\$1,950 (adults) and HK\$950 (children aged 3-12). These GA tickets are free seating and also grant you access to the South Stand, but don't forget – capacity is on a first come, first served basis and the South Stand is 18+.

ELEVATE YOUR EXPERIENCE: A [Captain's Lounge Pass](#) is the VIP upgrade you need to take your weekend to the next level. Enjoy a premium space, surprise visits from rugby legends, delicious food and free-flow drinks!

SINGLE-DAY TICKETS: Available exclusively on Klook, single-day tickets are priced at HK\$500 (Adult Friday), HK\$1,200 (Adult Saturday, Sunday), HK\$300 (Child Friday) and HK\$600 (Child Saturday, Sunday). These are subject to availability!

GET YOUR TICKETS: Download and register in the [HKCR ticketing app](#) to redeem your tickets. Your ticket's QR code will go live on the day of the event. Don't take a screenshot – it might invalidate your ticket!

STADIUM MAP & DIRECTIONS

Action-packed lineup? Check! World-class viewing? Check! Breathtaking scenes of Victoria Harbour, a fully retractable roof, 7 massive screens, and more? Check!



HOW TO GET THERE BY...

MTR: The stadium is a 10-15 minute walk from both Kai Tak MTR Station and Sung Wong Toi MTR Station.

PUBLIC BUS: The stadium is close to Kowloon City Bus Interchange, Argyle Street Playground Bus Stop, and Kowloon City Ferry Bus Terminus. Check all nearby bus routes at [CityBus](#) or [KMB](#).

TAXI OR CAR: The stadium features a taxi stand and parking spaces for coach buses and private cars. Nearby shopping malls also offer public parking facilities, but make sure you check the [Kai Tak Sports Park website](#) for the latest parking arrangements.

FERRY: There's a ferry service from North Point to Kowloon City Ferry Pier. Check out the time table, route and fares [here](#).

▼ WHERE TO SIT

KTSP is spoiling us with epic views of rugby action from all 50,000 seats. That said, every stand caters to a different spectator – and we have a feeling the move won't deter the die-hards.

Please don't forget, GA is on a first come, first served basis. We recommend arriving early to suss out and claim your preferred spot in this new venue!

NORTH STAND: Family-friendly, and relaxed, it's traditionally the home of the passionate Fijian contingent. GA entry is via Gate F.

WEST STAND: Ready to get up close and personal with the players? Chant, sing, cheer your heart out here! GA entry is via Gate F.

EAST STAND: While much of the East Stand is dedicated to suites and boxes, you can still soak up the electric atmosphere here. GA entry is via Gate F.

SOUTH STAND: Needing no introduction, our notorious South Stand is a global spectacle. Bigger, better, and bolder than ever, it's strictly 18+ for good reason. Note, entry is via Gate B and on a first come, first served basis, with fans normally lining up from the early hours!

SOUTH STAND SUPERPASS: If you're one of the lucky punters who snapped up a South Stand Super Pass upgrade before they sold out, you can enjoy priority access to the South Stand on the day you have purchased. The free-flow package details are as follows: Friday 28 March SuperPass: 5PM-8PM, Saturday 29 March SuperPass: 11AM-5PM, Sunday 20 March SuperPass: 11AM-5PM. Wristbands can be collected on the day, but don't forget - your pass **must be used in conjunction with a GA ticket** to gain stadium entry.



▼ TURN UP THE TUNES

SUNDAY HEADLINE ACT: The legendary Kaiser Chiefs are headlining the HK7s, bringing their high energy indie rock to the world's biggest rugby stage!

SATURDAY SINGALONG: This stacked line-up features dancefloor hits from DJ Pete Tong – but not before Italian icon GALA sets the pace with her multi-million sporting anthem 'Freed From Desire'.

FRIDAY OPENING CEREMONY: Usher in a new era of Hong Kong Sevens with our much-loved, traditional opening ceremony, featuring plenty of surprises and lots of local flavour.

FYI, it only takes a few choice lyrics to feel like a true 7s fan. Timeless tunes that return to stadium-wide cheers include Sweet Caroline by Neil Diamond, Come On Eileen by Dexys Midnight Runners, Chelsea Dagger by The Fratellis, Livin' On A Prayer by Bon Jovi, I'm Going to Be (500 Miles) by The Proclaimers, and Hey Baby by DJ Ötzi.



▼ FUEL UP

We're offering more food and drink options than ever, with over 30 F&B outlets – not to mention one of Asia's longest bars! With a dedicated fan village, harbourfront Dining Cove and over 70 restaurants within walking distance, the post-match party will continue well after the close of play at the fan village until 11pm.

▼ WHAT TO WEAR

You know the drill - come in your most outrageous fancy dress. This year, we're holding space for Wicked, gladiators, Deadpool & Wolverine duos, and many more main characters. Check out where to find the best costumes for the HK7s [here](#).

Kai Tak Stadium boasts a retractable roof, but a little poncho never hurt anyone. The roof status is determined at the start of the day, so be prepared for any unexpected showers!

▼ PACKING LIST

WHAT TO BRING: Keep your packing lean and mean to maximize your Sevens experience. Our tried and tested essentials include: sunscreen, wet wipes, plasters, sunnies, hat, power bank, and painkillers. Note that Kai Tak Sports Park is a cashless venue. Make sure you have a loaded Octopus and a card or two handy!
